Car Park Pick Up Area

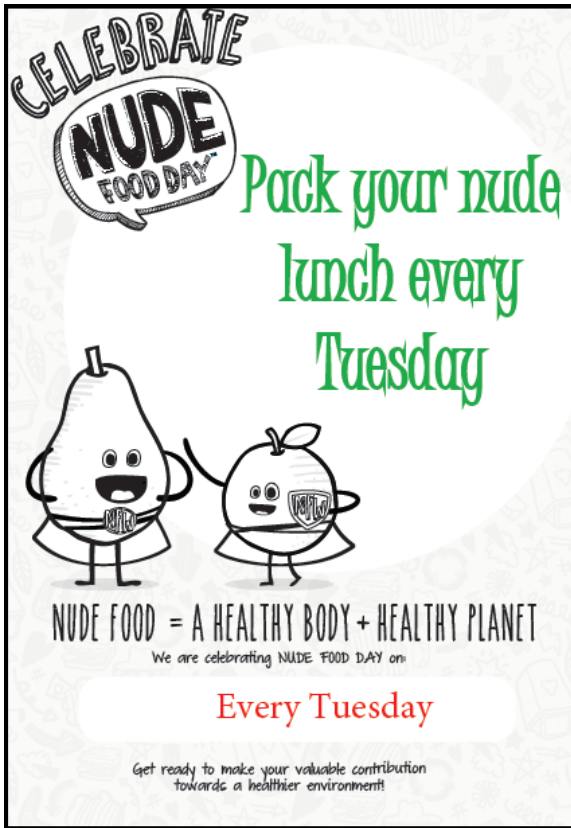

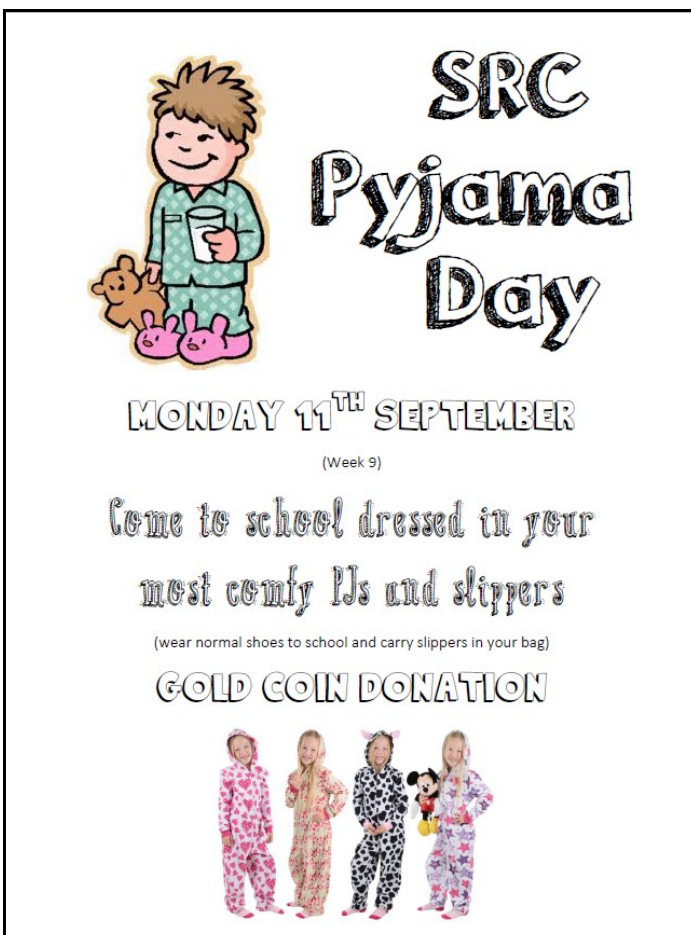
Cupcake Stall – Friday 8th September

Year 5 Waratah

In Year 5 Waratah, we have been discussing the things we can do to **reduce landfill** and be more environmentally responsible. We decided as a class, we should sort our rubbish more thoughtfully. So now, each morning, two students make a **paper liner for our bin** instead of using the heavy black liner, which is usually used. Each day 21 black plastic liners are used in classrooms and this number does not include the large bins around the playground.

We know plastic does not break down in landfill and each bag creates a problem for our environment. *Waratah students challenge other classes to make their own environmentally friendly bin liner.*

We have also researched **single use coffee cups** and the impact on landfill is really bad. These coffee cups are NOT recyclable they have a plastic liner and will take approximately **500 years** to break down. We have created posters to inform coffee and hot chocolate drinkers of the dangers of these coffee cups. *BYO reusable coffee cup and do your bit to help the environment*

Plastic bags and plastic wrap are another environmental problem that we have discussed. A simple solution is to make sure we take our own reusable canvas bags to the supermarket. Our world is being filled with plastic. Nude food Tuesdays will help to reduce the amount of plastic wrap in our landfill. *Waratah students encourage all Thurgoona students to aim to have nude food every day.*

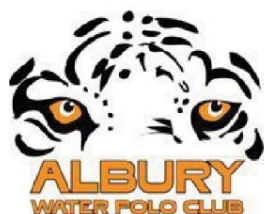

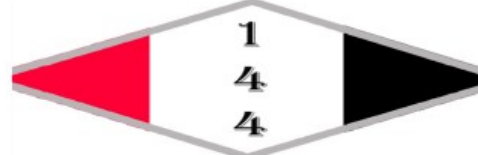
