Online Enrolment System

Don't forget that we are now accepting online enrolments!

Online enrolments provide flexibility for our parents to submit an enrolment application online, via the school website and at the time that best suits you. The application can be accessed on all browsers and mobile devices including iOS and Android.

The online application process is currently restricted to:

- Enrolments into local schools only
- Children who are Australian citizens, New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- Children who live in NSW.

If, however, you do not feel comfortable completing an application online, a paper copy will be available for collection from the front office or can be downloaded from the Department's going to a public school site.

- Orientation Day Tuesday, 1 December to continue (at this point)



Ways a Parent Can Help with

READING

Let your child see you reading!

Have magazines and books in your home.

Help your child find appropriate reading and word games online.

Keep a dictionary on hand. Help your child look up new words. 3

Read mysteries with your child and try to figure out the clues together.

Movie version coming out?

Read the book together first, then talk about which you each liked better. Set aside a time and place for your child to read -

like a comfy chair and a reading light in a quiet place 6 Visit your public library regularly.

Look for and read together the books that were your favorites when you were a kid.

Encourage your child to write -

letters, thank you notes, emails, journals, lists, stories about their own trips, events, and daily life

Ask your child to draw a comic strip about what happens in the story.

Provide word searches, crossword and other word games and puzzles, or help your child make his/her own Ask your child questions about what her or she is reading, such as:

- What is the story about?
- Who are the important people in the story?
- Where does the story take place?
- Why do you think that person made that choice?
- What do you think will happen next?
- How did you know about...?
- Would you recommend this book to your friends?



Share with your child about what you're reading... and encourage your child to do the same



2020 Tell Them From Me Parent/Carer Survey

This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent/carer survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted in Term 3. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.

The survey window opened Thursday, 20 August and will close at 5:00 p.m. Friday, 25 September.

2020 Representative sport program

The NSW Primary Schools and Combined High Schools Sports Association executive, in conjunction with the NSW Department of Education, made the difficult decision to suspend the representative school sport program for 2020; this includes Riverina activities. A number of factors were taken into account when deciding to suspend the program: the ongoing uncertainty of the consequences to daily life of the COVID-19 pandemic; the associated health risks for participants, including students, teachers, officials, family members and friends who may have wished to attend the events; the timeframes to select teams and the logistics of conducting the championships in an uncertain environment.

It is our intention to commence the representative school sport pathway at the beginning of the 2021 school year, when all schools, students and families can participate in a safe environment.

- NSWPSSA Girls' Cricket
- NSWPSSA Athletics


